Continuous Professional development

Change Agents UK is a charity and not-for-profit organisation. Their **Green careers and the future workforce course** is available for Careers leaders and teachers.

The course consists of three modules:

1. Overview of the climate crisis and sustainability – Where are we? How did we get here? How climate and sustainability link to different sectors and roles? Does business as usual need to change?
2. Future of work in the Green Transition – The Key impacts of the green transition on jobs, The green sector & “all jobs are green jobs”, Finding a green career, Corporate sustainability & identifying sustainable organisations

3. Sustainability skills & student journey -The core sustainability competencies wanted by employers, How we can help students to develop these skills within our offers, How we can best support students to enter green jobs and thrive in the green transition

They can host it in-person or online with two options:

- A three-hour workshop suitable for those who are time-scarce and/or already have some understanding of climate and sustainability topics
- An extended full-day workshop, which is recommended for those at the start of their sustainability journey who may want or need a more thorough overview of the green transition and sustainability skill

Their **Sustainable Futures Programme** is the student equivalent of our Green Careers & Future of Work training. They provide an overview of climate change and sustainability. Students engage in interactive activities to develop sustainability skills and help them find their perfect purpose-driven role. Suitable for students in further education, higher education and recent graduates

WWF: Sustainable futures:

The course includes three modules, split into bite-size 30-minute learning units for maximum flexibility. It can be delivered as part of your careers provision, within curriculum subjects or as an extra-curricular activity.
